Interesting Facts...

Out of the 14 peaks in the world with an altitude exceeding 8,000 meters, 8 of them are in Nepal, including Mount Everest (8,848 meters) the highest peak in the world!

Nepal is the only Hindu kingdom in the world. People worship 33 hundred million Gods within the Hindu religion. The number of Gods is about 13 times the current population of the country!

Nepalese hospitality is best known in the world for smiling faces, warm greetings and honesty!

The course fee is \$2,950 and includes tuition, roundtrip travel from USA (Boston or NYC) to Kathmandu, Nepal, all intra-country travel within Nepal, and all meals and rooms while in Nepal. Travel to / from USA departure airport, trip insurance and passport/visa fees are not included.
