Capping off the month, students and their parents had a special opportunity to showcase their Fair Trade smarts during MPFS' annual fall festival, Pizza & Pumpkin Night, where the Committee unveiled its original Fair Trade Quiz Game. Participants spun a wheel to



determine a question category (bananas, chocolate, coffee, sugar, tea, soccer, and wildcard) and responded to an age-appropriate question to win a Fair Trade sticker, bookmark, and hand



stamp. Adult players had their names entered into a drawing to receive one of five boxes of Alter Eco Fair Trade chocolate truffles. So, all in all, a fun and fair night for all!
